- Grantor and grantee partners agree that strong relationships are foundational for trust, transparency, and lasting impact. Building these relationships requires both time and intention.

1. Relationship Building as Key to Long-Term Impact:

Grantors can make progress by taking small, intentional steps, such as integrating relational check-ins or reflecting on shifting to flexible funding. These incremental efforts can create meaningful change without overwhelming limited capacity.
